#### International Wine Challenge celebrates UK wine industry at live awards evening



The <u>International Wine Challenge</u>, the world's most influential, impartial and rigorously judged wine competition, brought the UK wine industry together at a live awards evening on Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup> June to celebrate the winners of this year's competition.

In an open-air event space at the Kia Oval with social distancing measures in place, the International Wine Challenge unveiled its Champion and Merchant Award winners for 2021 and shone a spotlight on the extraordinary achievements of the teams behind those businesses. New awards were introduced this year to recognise the impressive work undergone by the trade this year, adapting to the everchanging landscape of life under Covid19.

The Harrow at Little Bedwyn was awarded IWC Restaurant Initiative of the Year, impressing the judges with the hundreds of free meals it supplied to the local community during lockdown, despite having closed in March 2020, as well as repurposing its restaurant to create an extremely successful gourmet takeaway service. Highly Commended was Newington Green restaurant, Tranga, who were a lifeline to the local community during the pandemic.

**IWC On-Trade Supporter of the Year** was awarded to **Hallgarten & Novum Wines** who worked with its suppliers to launch the widely praised initiative to supply 100,000 free glasses of wine to its ontrade customers. Hallgarten & Novum also received the award for **IWC Merchant Wine List of the Year** and was Highly Commended for IWC Large Agent of the Year and IWC Specialist Merchant of

the Year 2021 - Southern & Eastern Europe. **Bibendum Wine** and **Liberty Wines** were both Highly Commended for the **On-Trade Supporter of the Year** award. Liberty Wines also picked up **IWC Large Agent** and **IWC Wine Educator**, as well as **IWC Specialist Merchant** for **Australia** and **Italy**.

Impressing the judges with the scale of its logistics, the level of service it continued to offer its customers and the support given to its suppliers, The Wine Society took home IWC Dynamic Merchant of the Year and went on to win the top award of IWC Merchant of the Year 2021. The Wine Society achieved an astounding four further awards including IWC Wine Club of the Year and IWC Specialist Merchant of the Year for Austria, Portugal and Regional France. Highly Commended for the new IWC Dynamic Merchant of the Year award was Welsh-based wine importer and wholesaler, Daniel Lambert Wines, who has been a mouthpiece for the trade post-Brexit, highlighting the bureaucratic and financial challenges faced by businesses in its wake.

Also new for this year was the **IWC National Merchant of the Year** award which went to **Majestic Wine**, who had an extremely busy year implementing all-round improvements across service, training and their drinks range. The changes, along with a new website, reflect the passion of the business and investment in its future success.

Retailers of all sizes were celebrated in the awards ceremony on Wednesday evening, including supermarkets across the UK. Waitrose was awarded IWC Supermarket of the Year as well as IWC Specialist Merchant of the Year for England and Co-op was awarded IWC National Convenience Chain of the Year. Marks & Spencer also had a stellar evening winning two IWC Specialist Merchant of the Year awards for Rosé and Champagne and Sparkling as well as IWC Own Label Range of the Year.

- IWC Large Independent Merchant of the Year 2021: Cambridge Wine Merchants

Helen McGinn, Co-Chair and IWC UK Merchant Awards judge commented that: 'It's always important to take stock and recognise the brilliant work of people behind the wonderful industry we work in, and this year even more so. We were blown away with the entries we received and the support, collaboration and innovation that so many businesses have brought to the industry this year.'

The International Wine Challenge 2021 also revealed today its Top 10 scoring wines from this year's competition, which included the 'best in show' Champion wines announced during the awards evening. For the first time in the history of the competition, a Greek wine clinched the title of Champion White Wine, ranking alongside other top scoring entries from both old and new world countries.
