International Wine Challenge 2020

Great Britain takes its place on the world wine stage winning more gold medals than any other country for its size

The International Wine Challenge, the world's most influential and rigorously judged wine competition, has announced its results, revealing a record-breaking year for English wineries making Great Britain the most awarded wine producer in the world for its size.

A total of 14 English wines won Gold medals in the International Wine Challenge 2020. The list included sparkling, white and even a red wine (full list below). This success meant that Great Britain was ranked in 8th position worldwide out of 55 countries that entered wines, beating heavyweights of the wine aisles Argentina and Chile (who placed 10th and 11th respectively). When looked at from a global perspective, and factoring in the tiny amount of wine produced in Great Britain, compared with giants such as France, Spain and the US, Great Britain comes top by some margin:

Oz Clarke, one of the six co-chairs for the International Wine Challenge and author of English Wine commented: *'It's incredible to think that Great Britain is producing so many world class wines from such a small production. What became clear during the judging process was that the quality of wines from Great Britain is increasing every year and the style of wines that we are now producing is more diverse than ever.'*

Two of Great Britain's gold medals were awarded to red wines for the first time: Hencote's Pinot Noir 2018 from Shropshire and 'The Red Miller', a wine made from Pinot Meunier by Kent-based producer Hush Heath. Winning gold led to the latter also being awarded the first English Red Trophy and the James Rogers Trophy, for the best wine in its first year of production in this year's competition.

English sparkling wines were awarded 11 of Britain's Gold medals, cementing England's status as one of the world's best sparkling wine producers, winning 21% of all the gold medals awarded to sparkling wines in the competition.

Supermarket value champions and own label range of the year crowned

Selected from the competition's Great Value Trophy winners, the International Wine Challenge has awarded five world-class, budget-friendly wines as its Great Value champions, and they're all available in M&S and Tesco.

M&S won the prize for its sparkling and red wines and Tesco brought home the trophy for its sweet, white and fortified wines. With all of the wines available for £12 or under it's not just the supermarkets that will be celebrating.

The top three supermarkets of the competition were M&S, Waitrose and Tesco, bringing in a total of 14 gold medals for their wines. Two supermarket wines also received trophies with M&S' **El Duque de Miralta Rioja Reserva** (also a value champion) winning the trophies for best Rioja Reserva and best Rioja overall in the whole competition. The English Sparkling Rosé trophy was awarded to Waitrose's **Hattingley Valley Rosé**.

Berry Brothers & Rudd was awarded IWC Own Label Range of the Year 2020, fighting off stiff competition from Tesco, M&S and Asda.

Helen McGinn, International Wine Challenge co-chair, commented: *'UK supermarkets offer a real treasure-trove of delicious wines and we urge anyone looking for some great wines for Christmas to take note of our 2020 winners before they sell out! We hope wine-lovers everywhere will enjoy them as much as we did.'*
